What is an ECE?

ECE stands for Early Childhood Educator

Early Childhood Educators are an essential part of a child's early years, helping to prepare them to navigate the world and to enter into formal education. They provide high quality childcare and education in a variety of settings for children from birth to age 12.

Individuals who choose to work as Early Childhood Educators should:

- Be caring and have the desire to make a difference in the lives of children
- Be open to a variety of guiding strategies
- Have strong communication skills with children and parents of various cultural backgrounds

How do I Become an ECE?

To become a qualified Early Childhood Educator (ECE) you are required to take courses from an approved training institution.

In Golden, the College of the Rockies (COTR) is one of these approved institutions.

College of the Rockies ECE Program

- One-year certificate program to become a qualified ECE
- Starts in September each year
- Can be done full or part-time
- Program is online with practicum in local community
- Approximately \$3,800 in fees (excluding textbooks) to complete the ECE certificate program

ECE Types of Certification

- 1. ECE One Year Certificate:** Allows you to work as a fully certified ECE while completing your 500 hours under the supervision of a Canadian certified ECE. Can only be renewed once and then you apply for a 5-year certificate.
- 2. ECE Assistant Certificate:** ECE Assistants work alongside ECEs and/or Infant Toddler Educators in licensed childcare programs for children birth to 5 years of age. A great option for those who are working part-time while studying! ECE Assistants are not eligible for the wage top-ups that full ECEs can access.
- 3. Continuing Education:**
 - Obtain an ECE diploma with one or both Infant & Toddler and Special Needs
 - Bachelors of Child and Youth Care, OR Social Work
 - Complete a diploma in Child, Youth and Family Studies

Prerequisites

- High School Diploma
- 65% grade 12 level English (or equivalent via a College of the Rockies Academic English Assessment)
- Admission Package
 - Completion of immunization form
 - Criminal Record Check

Note: The College offers academic upgrading to obtain High School credits if you need to upgrade your English 12 to meet the 65% minimum or to finish your High School diploma .

Other Training Options

Other institutions offer online training towards and ECE certification.

One of these institutions is Pacific Rim Early Childhood Institute:

- Offers a monthly intake, year-round
- Can be done on a part-time or full-time basis
- Program is online with practicum in local community
- Approximately \$7,700 in fees (excluding textbooks) to complete the ECE certificate program

Dual Credit Program

- The COTR's Child, Youth and Family Studies offers a Dual Credit to high school students who would like to get a jump-start on a career in the health and human services field.
- Successful participants of the program will be eligible to apply for licensure to work as ECE Assistants.
- With our flexible online delivery, once working, students can pursue full certification in Early Childhood Education, Education Assistant or Human Service Work.

Training Supports

Work BC - Training Supports



If you are currently unemployed, under-employed or precariously employed, then WorkBC may be able to help.

To qualify for WorkBC Employment Services, you need to be:

- Not working; or
- Working less than 20 hours/week ; or
- Precariously employed - will be determined after conversation with Employment Counsellor

WorkBC can work with you to determine if skills training is necessary to help you achieve sustainable employment. If determined to be necessary, you may be eligible for financial supports to help cover tuition, text books, supplies, and living, childcare, and transportation costs.

Proceed through process to apply for Occupational Skills Training

- This process can take at least up to 8 weeks, and sometimes more. Do not wait to apply until it's too late.

There are training supports you can access yourself, without going through WorkBC.

ECE Education Support Fund*

- You can access up to \$4,000 (\$500 per course – max of 8 courses)
- Seasonal intakes
- Apply for this funding after you have secured a spot in a recognized course
- You will receive the funding after successful completion of your course, so you will need to pay for the course yourself in the first instance

Where Could I Work?

TYPES OF CHILD CARE

Group Child Care Setting: Community based facility or centre

- Under 3 years
- 2.5 years to school age
- School Age (before and after school care)
- Multi-age child care

In-Home Multi-age Child Care Setting: In child care provider's own home

- From birth to 12 years

Preschool Setting: Community based facility or centre

- 2.5 years old to school age

What Can I Earn?

There are currently a number of wage subsidies for qualified ECEs which can increase your hourly wage by up to \$8/hour.

With these wage subsidies included, a qualified ECE within the Columbia Basin could earn between \$23 to \$30/hour; currently the average is \$27.

Special yearly incentive for specialized Infant Toddler and Special Needs: \$2,000 if one certification or \$3,000 if both.

Early Childhood Group Care Centres

There are two Early Childhood Group Care Centres in Golden. As employers, they each have access to more funding streams to support their employees with training.
